Primary News: In our science experiments, as part of our Mad Monday science activities, the primary have been experimenting with molecules using milk as the sample. Milk is mainly made up of water with the other big ingredient usually being fat (not all milk has the same amount of fat). The dish soap bonds with the fat in the milk. This bond is so strong that the water and food colouring are pushed out. The swirling effect is everything else moving around to make room for the dish soap and fat bond. The visual effects of this experiment are amazing to watch.






Wauchope Historical Society: Thank you to Mrs Jeanette Rainbow, Mrs
